

These ports play a crucial role in facilitating the rapid and efficient transfer of goods, minimizing transportation time and costs. These advantageous locations not only strengthen the company's logistical capabilities but also support the efficient distribution and export of products. By connecting agricultural production hubs with major trade and export points, VP CEREALE enhances its ability to efficiently meet both domestic and international market demands.








Export

Animal Fattening Farm

In recent years, VP CEREALE has expanded its activity into the livestock sector by developing a cattle fattening farm located in the village of Vişina, Dâmboviţa County. This initiative is part of a broader strategy to diversify agricultural activities and achieve vertical integration in the production chain. Through its own feed factory, the company has the capacity to provide high-quality feed for its own farms, thus managing the entire animal feeding process. This integrated approach allows the maintenance of high standards regarding animal nutrition while also offering more efficient control over costs and the quality of the resulting products.





VP CEREALE Braila Dock

The Port of Brăila is located in the Brăila Free Zone, in Brăila County. VP CEREALE BZ SRL operates within the Brăila Free Zone through its own berth, offering handling/storage/loading/unloading services for cereals, livestock, cement, construction steel, scrap metal, salt, and general goods. The Brăila Free Zone operates under a Free Zone regime, which means that goods stored in this area are not subject to import taxes or other customs obligations during their storage period within the zone's perimeter. Perimeter I of the Brăila Free Zone includes the VP CEREALE berth (km 167+800), which serves as the central operations point for this facility. The Brăila Free Zone benefits from direct access to the maritime Danube and the railway system, being strategically located near the downstream berths of the Port of Brăila. The zone is capable of accommodating seagoing vessels with an average capacity of up to 8,750 deadweight tons (DWT). This space is intended for a wide range of productive activities, including grain storage, food processing, textile production, construction materials, metal product assembly, and others.







VP CEREALE BZ SRL Projects in Port Braila

VP CEREALE BZ SRL is considering a series of ambitious projects aimed at transforming the Braila Free Zone into a leading industrial hub. These projects include:

Industrial Park: The creation of an industrial park will open new opportunities for industries, including manufacturing and services. The park will feature modern production halls, upgraded infrastructure, and a container loading/unloading terminal, positioning the area for growth and development.

Cement Terminal: The plan includes the construction of a terminal for the unloading and storage of both bulk and packaged cement. This project will require the purchase of two specialized machines and the construction of a storage hall. The demand for cement in Romania is rising, with an annual consumption of 10.5 million tons. Currently, most cement imports come from domestic factories or a single importer based in Port Mangalia. There is no cement terminal of this type in the Braila/Galati area, making this project a key opportunity for the region.

Live Animal Terminal: The proposed live animal terminal will be the first of its kind in the Free Port Zone, offering new opportunities for the transportation and handling of livestock. The Port of Braila is located in a region with numerous livestock farms, many of which currently export their products through Port Midia.

Inland Railway Investment: The extension of the railway to the inland area of Berth will enable direct transfer of goods between ships and trains, increasing flexibility in handling various types of cargo. Currently, the railway extends only up to the entrance of VP CEREALE's key in the Braila Free Zone, with a transfer distance of approximately 400 meters between the train and the berth.

These investments are vital for infrastructure development, facilitating trade and the transit of goods not only in Romania but also in neighboring countries such as Ukraine, Moldova, and others in the Black Sea region. Furthermore, these initiatives will foster economic growth and sustainable development in the area.

In light of the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, the Port of Braila is poised to become a crucial hub for rerouting goods and avoiding affected areas. The increased demand for port services will stem from the need to diversify trade routes and manage transport flows more effectively. After the conflict concludes, the Port of Braila will play a key role in the reconstruction of Ukraine. It is expected to become an important logistics center for transporting materials vital for rebuilding efforts, further solidifying its strategic position in the region.



In the current global context, the grain trade sector is experiencing sustained growth, driven by increased demand for food and animal feed. A significant rise in the world population and accelerated urbanization are leading to a growing demand for grains, which are used for both human and animal consumption.
