

By 2020 the Arab States of the Gulf (GCC) population is forecast to reach 53.5m, a 30% increase over the level in 2000.

Over the same period, the region's real GDP is expected to grow by 56%. Nominal GDP, which was US\$341.6bn in 2000, is forecast to soar to over US\$1trn in 2010 and US\$2trn in 2020. Although the economic forecast is positive, it carries a risk: that unmanaged growth will bring negative side effects such as power shortages and soaring prices for food.

Some GCC states are already experiencing sporadic shortages of electricity and gas, while water supplies are already strained and food shortages loom as risks for an import dependent region.

A key challenge for the Gulf in the next decade therefore will be to manage energy, water, and food resources to ensure both high living standards and sustainable growth in the long term.

Aware of these challenges, Gulf Arab states are undertaking a variety of measures to ensure long-term sustainable growth.

#### Introduction:

In 2021, there was a tremendous focus on wellness and prevention to curb chronic diseases. The other big trend is more private sector participation. In fact, private sector participation is set to increase by almost 30 to 50 percent. The next trend will be in insurance-based healthcare financing and the insurance system, resulting in growth opportunities, especially in virtual health. Localization of manufacturing and localization of the workforce is another big area of growth. For the region, it is expected that 30 percent of medical devices and 40 percent of pharmaceutical products will be manufactured locally by 2025. Local manufacturing is set to increase from 2 percent to almost 30 percent in the next four years. Moreover, digitalization by way of home to hospital is where the infrastructure is going to be built. Today, 50 percent of hospitals in the UAE and KSA use some level of digital solutions and IT based access. Also, it has been observed that 80 percent of doctors are using tablets, smartphones, and medical applications.

## What are the main sectors attracting investment in the GCC countries in the coming years?

There is no doubt that the Swiss private sector has a valuable opportunity to benefit from the infrastructure projects, such as the railway project, which is more than 2,200 kilometers and is expected to provide more than 80 thousand jobs for the GCC citizens and expatriates, as well as opportunities derived from the localization of the railway industry, and thus the Geneva Chamber can benefit from this plan for example by calling the experts in this industry to build a center for sustainability, training and rehabilitation of specialists of GCC in order to build a real railway industry.

There are many opportunities in the industrial sector, in this side the Swiss investors can benefit from the opportunities offered by the Gulf Organization for Industrial Consulting (GOIC). Also, Geneva Chamber of Commerce can benefit from the vision of Saudi Arabia 2030, which included many opportunities through the privatization of important sectors such as health, education, infrastructure, entertainment, and tourism. Other important opportunities are available through Expo 2020 in Dubai and the importance of Switzerland's presence in this exhibition, as well as the World Cup 2022 to be organized in Doha, and other opportunities in Bahrain through the Vision of the Kingdom of Bahrain 2030, which has achieved many positive results so far, in addition to industrial sectors opportunities and logistics services in the region of Duqm in the Sultanate of Oman, which is located in the most strategic areas and launched in 2008.

There is the possibility to benefit as well from partnerships with the Kuwaiti private sector and the government sector through the establishment of partnership projects between the private and public sectors in Kuwait. Swiss companies can establish joint ventures in the United Arab Emirates, especially in the areas of energy, banking and various services and benefit from a large and promising market.
